6. Highway Superintendent- Jeremy Fraim.

b. The department has a telescopic boom lift rented to process some tree work along the entire length of Lawrence Hill Road and to prepare for this summer's project.

c. Filled some major holes on the dirt portion of Canadice Hill Road.

d. We were able to collect funds for the cleanup of the materials illegally dumped on Cratsley Hill Road. DEC is in charge of the investigation.

e. Seven full fleet plow and/or salt runs and two with a truck or two due to drifting and localized snow since the March meeting.

f. Installed dash cameras in the vehicle fleet that are incorporated into the Verizon GPS Fleet tracking units.

g. Auctions International took pictures of the 2016 F-550 so the listing can be posted.

7. Honeoye Lake Watershed Research Task Force- Councilman Gronwall.

a. The updated written report for the month of March was submitted (see T.C. file).

b. Honeoye Lake level is still high. Rainfall in the first quarter of 2024 and March 2024 are normal.

c. Ontario County has received the NYS grant contract for the boat wash station. Once NYS accepts the replies from Ontario County, the grant funds will be available and the boat wash station should be available for the coming season.

Supervisor Vastola and Highway Superintendent Fraim met via Zoom with NYSDOT and Senator Helming's office to appeal the decision not to move the speed limit reduction sign on County Road 37 further away from the Highway Department entrance/exit. The lack of a speed limit posting on Jersey Hill Road will be discussed at another time.

3. AED's need to be ordered for the Town Hall and Highway Department. Councilman Statt will get pricing information and provide it to the Supervisor. The Board agreed they should be purchased.

4. Supervisor Vastola indicated Tibbals Road Cemetery and Canadice Hollow Cemetery need fencing. Councilman Statt will look into material and costs for the purchase and installation. Councilwoman Crowley will get a PSA number since prevailing wage will need to be used due to the cost that would be involved.

WHEREAS, the Budget Officer recommends that the Town execute a new agreement for an additional 100 hours for the cost of \$8,500.00 to ensure our technology needs are up to date and information is protected from a breach of our systems; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Board authorizes the Supervisor to execute said agreement for 100 hours of service for \$8,500.00 and remittance of the agreement fee upon receipt of a fully executed document; and, be it further

WHEREAS, an evaluation of products from qualified vendors/distributors will allow the Budget Officer to determine best value combined with best price; now, therefore be it
