We will be planting trees and shrubs provided through the NYS DEC Trees 4 Tribes Program. Planting these native plants will help to improve wildlife habitat and stabilize the newly constructed stream channel.

**When:** April 22<sup>nd</sup> 2017, 1PM-3PM

**Where:** County Road 36, Meet at the entrance to the DEC Wildlife Management Area, 2 miles south of Muller Field Station. The entrance is next to the red house at 6913 County Road 36. Event signs will be posted.

**What to bring:** Please be prepared to get muddy! Dress for the weather. Boots, gloves and shovels are recommended.
