- a. Councilman Hershey indicated they will be working with DEC to begin blue-green algae testing in June. Mr. Gronwall mentioned they don't know how often the tests will take place yet. One sample will be taken in the deepest part of the lake in the early morning. Then DEC has asked that we go around the perimeter to find the two most severe blue-green algae blooms near shore to sample. Mr. Gronwall indicated the official ice-out date is April 10<sup>th</sup>.

  - c. The weed harvesting program is set to start July 7<sup>th</sup>.
