A. CONVOCATION:

1. The Canadice Town Board Meeting was held on December 9, 2013 at 7:30 pm at the Canadice Town Hall.

2. Roll call showed the following-

4. Approval of November 11, 2013 Regular Meeting Minutes-

2. Catharine Crane addressed the Board asking how they felt about her Turtle Rock Hollow business proposal and if there are any questions regarding the scope of the project. The majority of the Board felt it was a reasonable project for Canadice and wished her luck in her venture. Councilman O'Connor didn't have enough information to comment on it at this point since it's still in the hands of the Planning Board. Ms. Crane indicated she will be submitting another site plan application in January with the project on the east side of County Road 36 which should address the safety concerns with crossing the road. It wouldn't be a canopy ropes course, but would utilize telephone poles for an adventure ropes course. Her intent is to attend the December Planning Board meeting to get concerns from them and address those items when the application is submitted in January. Supervisor Singer indicated they wouldn't be able to address anything until the plan is submitted. Mr. Mayhood indicated if Ms. Crane wants to come to the December Planning Board meeting the submit would be helpful to either party if there is no site plan in hand. She is welcome to attend and let the Planning Board know of her intent, but not to expect any questions at this point.

6. Highway Superintendent- Mr. Bruce Longbine.

a. Thanked the Board for their support during his time in office, it was appreciated very much.

b. The equipment replacement schedule was discussed and preliminary information on equipment was provided to the Board. Superintendent Longbine also discussed information regarding state bids.

c. Superintendent Longbine has still been discussing a shared contract for a grader with the Town of Richmond.

d. Councilman O'Connor questioned replacing or taking down any stop signs from the stop sign study that was completed. Superintendent Longbine indicted he was still waiting for the determination regarding changing the speed limit on Canadice Lake Road. He does have a few of the signs purchased. Supervisor Singer will pull the paperwork to submit the speed limit reduction request again.

e. Superintendent Longbine brought up the possibility of opening the dump site periodically. He did make arrangements for a person that contacted him recently to take their load to Richmond. Richmond doesn't have anyone working at their site. It is strictly for tree limbs and leaves. So that is another item to keep in mind.

7. Honeoye Lake Watershed Research Taskforce Liaison- Councilman Hershey.

a. The HLWT held a meeting and discussed the WQIP grants. Mr. Emerick from OCSW wrote a grant for hydroseeding ditches in the county. The grant Councilman Hershey wrote went through for

roadside treatments; retention ponds, vernal pools and several BMP's for the Honeoye Lake Watershed to slow down storm water. All the current projects are in the newsletter.

E. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. Highway Superintendent Vacancy- Supervisor Singer outlined possible options and will advertise in a few papers for the position. In the meantime we can appoint the Deputy Highway Superintendent to act as Highway Superintendent temporarily. Deputy Highway Superintendent Zeh questioned what adjustment would be made to his stipend and the Board discussed several options that Supervisor Singer will discuss with him. Councilman Virgil asked what the job description lists for Highway Superintendent. Supervisor Singer indicated there really isn't one since it is an elected position. We can highlight items that should be part of the person's qualifications, but they have to be a resident. Councilman Virgil questioned Superintendent Longbine if Deputy Superintendent Zeh will have enough time to process the bills or paperwork in addition to the other requirements. Superintendent Longbine indicated their part-time person has already indicated he could come in to work if the Deputy Superintendent needs time to work on administrative issues.
